

Screening Event for Families of People with Type 1 Diabetes

This screening is part of a national research program called Type 1 Diabetes TrialNet. TrialNet is currently screening relatives of people with type 1 diabetes.

Researchers are conducting this study to understand more about the development of type 1 diabetes and to look at ways to delay or prevent type 1 diabetes.

Through a blood test, doctors can determine if an individual may be at risk for diabetes—years before symptoms appear.

Family members of people with type 1 diabetes—parents, children, brothers and sisters—are eligible to be screened. Cousins, nieces, nephews and grandchildren may also be eligible
